





ORDER

Naeem Akhtar Afghan, CJ. This order disposes of Constitution Petition Nos.959, 960, 961, 1070, 1112 of 2020, 120, 133, 377 of 2021, 43, 765 and 833 of 2022 as identical questions of facts and law are involved in all the constitution petitions.

In CP Nos. 959, 960, 961, 1070, 1112 of 2020, 133, 377 of 2021, 2. 765 of 2022, the petitioners have challenged the order 43 F.No.1(48)Jurisdiction/2014-132522-R dated 05.08.2020 issued by Inland Revenue Federal Board of Revenue, Revenue Division Government of Pakistan (published in the gazette of Pakistan) assigning jurisdiction, functions and cases to Large Taxpayer's Unit ('LTU') Karachi which is annexed with table-B containing the names of the petitioners and other Large Taxpayer in pursuance whereof vide letter dated 13.08.2020 request has been made by Additional Commissioner LTU Karachi to Additional Commissioner Headquarters Regional Tax Office ('RTO') Quetta to provide complete case record of the petitioners and 37 other Large Taxpayers of Province of Balochistan in hard and soft form to LTU Karachi.

After issuing notices to the respondents in all the above constitution petitions, the operation of impugned Order F.No.1 (48) Jurisdiction/2014-132522-R dated 05.08.2020 was suspended by this Court.

In CP No.120 of 2021, the petitioner has challenged the notice dated 13.01.2021 under section 176 (1) of the Income Ordinance 2001 (hereinafter "the Ordinance") issued by the Assistant/Deputy Commissioner AEOI Federal Board of Revenue LTU, Islamabad due to change of jurisdiction for the petitioner from RTO, Quetta to LTU Islamabad

While issuing notice to the respondents in the above constitution petition the operation of the notice dated 13.01.2021 issued to the petitioner by LTU Islamabad was suspended.

In CP No.833 of 2022, the petitioner has challenged the issuance 4. of notice dated 27.01.2022 under section 138(1) of the Ordinance by Assistant/Deputy Commissioner Builders and Developers FBR Zone Unit-I RTO Islamabad due to change of jurisdiction for the petitioner from RTO Quetta to RTO Islamabad.

While issuing notice to the respondents in the above constitution petition, the operation of the notice dated 27.01.2022 issued to the petitioner by LTU Islamabad was suspended.

CP Nos. Nos.959, 960, 961, 1070 and 1112 of 2020 have been 5. contested by the respondents by filing parawise comments bearing the signatures of Chief Commissioner RTO Quetta with the contention that change of jurisdiction in no way hampers the Large Taxpayers as all the tax processes are fully automated in the LTU offices and the process of refund is done electronically and refund is directly credited into the bank account of the Large Taxpayers; the Notifications pertaining to transfer of jurisdiction to LTUs in no way affects the business of the petitioners; the criteria for distribution of share of Province of Balochistan from NFC Award include multiple parameters and the impact of tax deducted from the petitioners on the share of Balochistan in NFC is nil; the provisions of Income Tax Ordinance 2001, Sales Tax Act 1990 and section 29 of the Federal Excise Act 2005 with relevant rules provide legal justification to FBR to transfer jurisdiction of any case.

ments and by relying upon the parawise comments filed by the respondents in

the connected constitution petitions.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioners, learned Additional Attorney General, Mr. Sohail Ahmed Ansari Advocate learned counsel for FBR and Mr. Touquer Ahmed Seehar Advocate learned counsel for Chief Commissioner Inland Revenue LTU Karachi, we have perused the available record which reveals that vide Notification F.No.6(862)Jurisdiction/2017-190865-R dated 20.10.2020 Inland Revenue Federal Board of Revenue, Revenue Division Government of Pakistan has already transferred back jurisdiction for 12 Large Taxpayers of the Province of Balochistan from LTU Karachi to RTO Quetta and the above Notification has also been issued in the Gazette of Pakistan but surprisingly without assigning any cogent reason, the transfer of jurisdiction back to RTO Quetta from LTU Karachi, LTU Islamabad and RTO Islamabad has not been made for the petitioners being Large Taxpayers of Province of Balochistan.

- The above reveals that the petitioners have been discriminated by 8. the respondents in clear violation of principle of equality as provided under Article 25 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan 1973 (hereinafter "the Constitution").
- Record transpires that apart from soft data, hard data of the petitioners has also been required to be transferred from RTO Quetta to LTU Karachi, LTU Islamabad and RTO Islamabad which will be a cause of inconvenience to the executives of the petitioners in case they have to personally appear in LTU Karachi, LTU Islamabad and RTO Islamabad at the time of assessment.
- It further reveals that due to change of jurisdiction of the 10. petitioners to LTU Karachi, LTU Islamabad and RTO Islamabad, the appellate jurisdiction will also be changed to Karachi and Islamabad and for redressal of any grievance by invoking constitutional jurisdiction under Article 199 of the Constitution, the jurisdiction will also change from Balochistan High Court to Islamabad High Court and Sindh High Court.
- In the written statement submitted by Federal Board of Revenue on 11. 08.04.2021 bearing signature of Muhammad Abid Chief (IR-Formation) FBR, Islamabad in CP No.815 of 2020 which was filed by 08 Large Taxpayers of rovince of Balochistan challenging their transfer of jurisdiction to LTU Karachi and which has been disposed of due to redressal of their grievances in view of otification dated 20.10.2020 issued by Inland Revenue FBR, Revenue Division Government of Pakistan for shifting back the jurisdiction to their extent from LTU Karachi to RTO Quetta, it has been mentioned that 2.5% weightage is

assigned to the tax collection in NFC Award for vertical and horizontal revenue distribution amongst the Provinces.

Due to change of jurisdiction of the petitioners from RTO Quetta 12. to LTU Karachi, LTU Islamabad and RTO Islamabad, 2.5% weightage of tax collection in NFC Award will not be attributed to the Province of Balochistan which will eventually change the vertical and horizontal revenue distribution in NFC Award.

For the above reasons, all the constitution petitions are accepted. The impugned order F.No.1(48)Jurisdiction/2014-132522-R dated 05.08.2020 issued by Inland Revenue Federal Board of Revenue, Revenue Division Government of Pakistan Islamabad, the notice dated 13.01.2021 under section 176 (1) of the Income Ordinance 2001 issued by the Assistant/Deputy Commissioner AEOI Federal Board of Revenue LTU, Islamabad and notice dated 27.01.2022 under section 138(1) of the Ordinance by Assistant /Deputy Commissioner Builders and Developers FBR Zone Unit-I RTO Islamabad to the extent of the petitioners are declared null, void and of no legal effect. The respondents are directed to transfer

the jurisdiction for the petitioners to RTO Quetta from LTU Karachi, LTU

amabad and RTO Islamabad with immediate effect.
